GRAND MASTER'S REMARKS



In accordance with the established customs and traditions, Know ye, that I, TERENCE JACKSON,



Choosing to smile at that stranger.

According to a 2012 study, smiling at a stranger can <u>give us a greater sense of connection</u>. 


