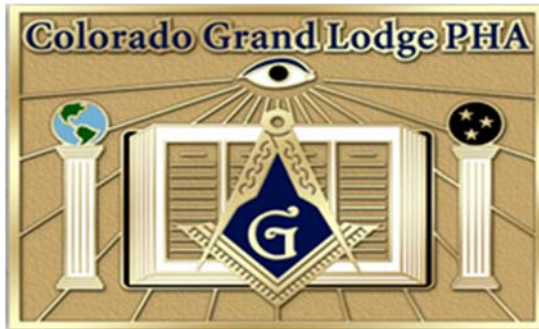

PROCLAMATION 2015-08

July 10, 2015

TO: All Elected and Appointed Grand Lodge Officers, Most Worshipful Past Grand Masters,

Worshipful Masters, Concordant Bodies of Masonry Owing Allegiance to the Most Worshipful Prince Hall Grand Lodge, F&AM, Colorado and its Jurisdiction, Inc., Grand Worthy Matron and Grand Worthy Patron, Columbine Grand Chapter Order of the Eastern Star PHA.

GREETINGS: Proclamation No. 2015 – 08: Prince Hall Americanism Day

KNOW YE BY THESE PRESENT, in accordance with established customs and traditions of the Code of the Most Worshipful Prince Hall Grand Lodge, Free and Accepted Masons of Colorado, Wyoming, and Utah and by the power and authority in me vested as the Most Worshipful Grand Master of Prince Hall Masons, I, Terence Jackson, do hereby request and direct all lodges of this Grand Jurisdiction to celebrate Prince Hall Americanism Day by some suitable service or ceremony on or about Sunday, September 13, 2015, which is hereby set aside, observed, and celebrated as Prince Hall Day. An invitation is being extended to the Grand Worthy Matron, Columbine Grand Chapter, O.E.S., P.H.A., to participate in this program. I also encourage you to invite the Sisters of your local Chapters to share in this occasion with you.

Prince Hall, whom we as Prince Hall Masons recognize as the Father of Negro Masonry in the United States, made it possible for us today to be recognized and to enjoy all the privileges of Free and Accepted Masons. He was born in Barbados, B.W.I., in 1748 and settled in Boston, Massachusetts in the year 1765. On March 6, 1775 Prince Hall and fourteen other Negro men were initiated in Masonry in an Irish Military Lodge, No. 441, and in March 1775 Prince Hall organized the First Black Lodge of Free Masons in the United States under the name of African Lodge No. 1 and they operated by Warrant No. 459, (that was granted in 1784 but not received until 1787). This warrant was issued from the Grand Lodge of England and they were re-named as African Lodge Number 459. On June 24, 1791, African Grand Lodge was formed. To honor its founder, the name was change to The Prince Hall Grand Lodge of Massachusetts in 1808. Today Colorado's Prince Hall Masonry can be traced as follows, Massachusetts, to Rhode Island then to Pennsylvania, then to Ohio, then to Kansas, then to Colorado Territory. On November 17, 1867 Rocky Mountain Lodge No.1 in Denver, Colorado was duly organized as a part of the Kansas Jurisdiction. On 17 January 1876 the Prince Hall Grand Lodge of Colorado was formed and continues to flourish today as the Most Worshipful Prince Hall Grand Lodge of Colorado and its Jurisdictions, Inc.

On March 12, 1947 the Grand Lodge of Massachusetts acknowledged Negro Masonry of Prince Hall affiliation in that state to be legitimate and "duly constituted." Since that time the courts of many of the several states and the U.S. Supreme Court have decreed Prince Hall Masonry to be legitimate and duly constituted. May Brotherly Love Prevail.

Given under my hand as Most Worshipful Grand Master of Prince Hall Masons of Colorado and its Jurisdictions this 10th day of July 2015, and to which I have caused to be affixed the Seal of the Grand Lodge of Colorado by the Grand Secretary.

Worshipful Masters, have this Proclamation read at your next communications, until 14 September 2015.

ARTICLE

The Perfect Way to Introduce Yourself (in Any Setting)

Make your introduction about your audience and not yourself while I have no soccer skills, I once played in a fairly competitive adult soccer league with my then-teenage stepson. I was terrible, but I played because he asked me to. (When your kids get older and ask you to do something with them, the first time you say no might be the last time you get asked.)

As we took the field before a game, a guy on the other team strutted over, probably picking me out because I was clearly the oldest player on the field. (There's a delightful sentence to write.) "Hello," he said. "I'm Louis Winthorpe III, CEO of My Company Is Better Than Yours Inc." (Not real names, but accurate in spirit.) "Hi, I'm Jeff," I said, shaking his hand. "Didn't think I'd make it on time," he said. "Had to finalize a big contract, rattle a few chains at an overseas facility, and inspect a property we're going to buy." How do you respond to that? "Wow," was the best I came up with. "Ah, not really," he said. "Same stuff, different day."

I was trying to match the drollness of my "Wow" when my stepson stepped in, half-smile on his lips and full twinkle in his eyes, and rescued me by saying, "Come on, we need to get ready." Was Louis cocky? Certainly, but only on the surface. His \$400 cleats, carbon fiber shin guards, and "I'm the king of the business world" introduction was an unconscious effort to protect his ego. His introduction said, "Hey, I might not turn out to be good at soccer, but out there in the real world, where it really matters, *I am the Man.*" While he introduced himself to me, *he* was his real audience. And that was a shame. On that field, for that hour, he could have just been a soccer player. He could have sweated and struggled and possibly rekindled that ember of youth that burns less brightly with each passing year. How do *you* introduce yourself? When you feel particularly insecure, do you prop up your courage with your introduction? Do you make sure to include titles or accomplishments or "facts," even when you don't need to? If so, that makes your introduction all about you and not your audience. Instead:

- **Decide that less will always be more.** Brief introductions are always best. Provide the bare minimum the other person needs to know, not in an attempt to maintain distance but because during the conversation more can be revealed in a natural, unforced, and therefore much more memorable way.
- **Stay aware of the setting.** If you meet another parent at a school meeting, for example, just say, "Hi, I'm Joe. My daughter is in third grade." Keep your introduction in context with the setting. If there is no real context, like at a soccer game, just say, "Hi, I'm Joe. Good luck!"
- **Embrace understatement.** Unless you're in a business setting, your job title is irrelevant. If you're asked what you do and you do happen to be the CEO of My Company Is Better Than Yours Inc., just say you work there. To err is human; to err humble is always divine.
- **Focus on the other person.** Ask questions. Listen. The best connections never come from speaking; they always come from listening.

After the game a few kids from both teams were teasing me about one of my passes they felt should win the informal "Worst Pass of the Season If Not in the History of Soccer" award. I was more than cool with that, because the banter signaled a camaraderie and acceptance that is never given but earned. I glanced over and saw Louis, alone as he packed up his gear, and felt a twinge of sadness. He never let himself just be a soccer player. He never gave himself a chance to be a teammate, to fit in and enjoy a shared purpose, however momentary or meaningless that purpose might be. When you introduce yourself, be who you are. Embrace the moment and the setting for what it says about you *in that setting* and not in comparison with titles or accomplishments. Just be yourself: skills and triumphs and struggles and failures and all. Always trust that who you are is more than enough. Because it always is.

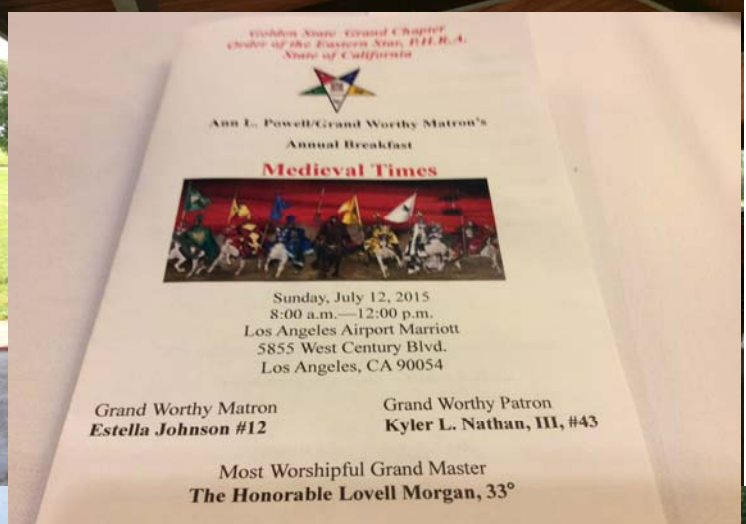

8 Musts for effective leaders

Legendary business journalist Marshall Loeb spent decades interviewing the greatest leaders of American business. Along the way, he defined these steps to effective leadership.

- ◆ **Know the difference** between leading and managing. Loeb liked to quote Warren Bennis on this: “Leaders are people who do the right things; managers are people who do things right. There’s a profound difference.”
- ◆ **Develop your sense of purpose.** “What employees want most from their company leaders,” Loeb wrote, “is direction and meaning, trust and hope.”
- ◆ **Show courage.** Sometimes, that means the courage to be extremely unpopular.
- ◆ **Use candor.** When you say what you really think, encourage the people you lead to do the same.
- ◆ **Limit yourself** to just a few key objectives. Loeb quotes Jack Welch on this: “I have only three things to do: I have to choose the right people, allocate the right number of dollars, and transmit ideas from one division to another with the speed of light.”
- ◆ **Borrow the best ideas** and methods from others. GE was among the first to study and apply Wal-Mart’s retailing systems.
- ◆ **Remember** that great leaders are made, not born. “They’re made,” Loeb observed, “usually, self-made.”
- ◆ **Be yourself.** Figure out what you’re good at and stick to it.
